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School Annual Education Report (AER) Horizon High School

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Horizon High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2022-23 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school is a Comprehensive Support and Intervention (CSI) school. As a CSI school, we are faced with several challenges. Students entering our program are 16-19 years of age. Many of these students have not attended school regularly prior to enrolling with us due to different circumstances in their lives. In order to accelerate student achievement and create a culture of continuous improvement, differentiated instruction and a leveled literacy program is at the heart of our curriculum.

 Horizon Alternative Education services 16-19 year old students through the use of teacher instruction and virtual learning. Students attend school 5 days per week 6.0 hours per day.
